First Reading 1 Kings 17:10-16

Jesus' offering of himself surpasses any sacrifice a Temple high priest might have made for the sins of his people.

Gospel Mark 12:38-44

Jesus observes how some people take advantage of others. He watches a widow donate her last pennies to the lucrative Temple cult.

The Synod process

Pope Francis has Ordered? Invited? us to take part in it. Bishop Alan has launched its implementation in his Diocese and ordered? invited? us to play our part. There is a Diocesan Synod Team. I am required to provide this team with the name of a contact person from SToC. Will anyone volunteer?

First reaction

Mine has been negative. From several people I pick up puzzlement, and I do not hear much enthusiasm for it. *"How many times have we gone round this circle?"* Better World Movement, Messengers... But this week a glimmer of light has come to me as I read the explanatory documents. What Pope Francis is asking is something quite different. He is not asking us to solve problems. He has no blueprint in hand. There are not even proposals to get us started. Will you help me to start a group? First of all to grasp what is afoot?

Remember

Six years ago he asked us to talk honestly to each other about family and marriage. He asked us to speak out our honest beliefs and feelings. No trotting out the party line. We met together and in groups several times. We put up summaries on large notice boards. You then added a great number of *post-its* which were your comments, doubts, agreement and disagreements. It all went up to the eventual meeting of the bishops in Rome - though we did have to push a little to get our frank opinions through. The teaching of the church on marriage has developed as a result of the whole exercise. Not the basics. But our judgments have changed. I think also our understanding of how laws and regulations fit into real life.

Stage one of Synodal process

Meet, speak to each other, listen. You have perhaps heard people say: *"If I were Pope for a day I would..."* Whimsey. Each of us has a whole list of things for demolition. Our church hereabouts is haemorrhaging fast. Get rid of clericalism, of the power and control, of outdated parts of canon law. Give women their proper place. But No! No! This synod is not at all to be like that. Just a hint from Chesterton. He wrote: "I woke up on Christmas Day to see at the end of my bed two stockings filled with a magnificent gift: a pair of feet". Clear? The first thing we have to do is to discover what the Synod is about, and our part in it. Enough till next week. But I hold my breath for a volunteer contact person to come forward.
