Jubilees

Michael and I asked you to come to our mass last Sunday to share our joy and thank God for our happy and muchblessed years of priesthood. We wanted nothing more and you respected that wish. But how well you contributed to make a heartfelt mass and celebration in Becket. We thank you: for many cards, for your presence, for all the affirmation you gave us. My childhood memories are of there always being priests in our home, not least because I had 3 uncles friarpriests. Their example drew me and I started at the ridiculously early age of 16, and rarely looked back. The parish was always our priority in those days, to be confirmed by what we have known since ordination. I thank you of the Catholic Women's League for much generosity and expertise in preparing the decoration, the cake and the buffet. We are still blessed in sharing the parish with you. Thank you.

Communion from the chalice

The bishops have given "permission" for us to resume this practice, prohibited till now because of covid. The same bishops have in the past month required all Parish Priests to view 3 hours instructing us in detail of our duty of care. You see one example in the nosings of many steps now marked in vivid yellow lest you trip. Such details are the bishops' concern for you. We have consulted medical experts about the risk of sharers of the chalice contracting covid. Their advice told us the risk is high. Still higher for the minister and priest who must consume the precious blood remaining. Consequently we have decided that we will not offer the opportunity of drinking from the chalice at communion. Jesus is totally present in the host. Our concentration must be on him, keeping all safe from infection. We do care for your health and safety.

Children's liturgy at Sunday 10 am mass.

We hope to be able to begin a limited service shortly after Easter. Several have generously volunteered to provide this care and teaching opportunity. Still we do need more ready to help. But whether helper or not everyone can do more. Stories are essential. From them we learn. I notice you bring many books to keep your children occupied at mass. But I do not see any of them relating to what we are doing and for what you bring your children to mass. So we are preparing to offer you some suggestions of suitable booklets for stories and colouring. They will not be of Peppa Pig, Captain Marvel or dinosaurs. Rather of Jesus and those around him. The bible is full of glorious tales. I hope after Easter some will begin to appear in our excellent church shop.
