Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) 14th February 2021

Today's readings revolve around healing and belief. Jesus risks touching a diseased man in order to heal him, while Paul talks about challenges of conscience in a world of differing beliefs. The invitation here is to be open to the call to trust that God is at work amid our fear of difference and "otherness" and our fear of the darkness within ourselves.

First Reading Leviticus 13:1-2. 44-46

The book of Leviticus shows us the practical implications of the Law of Moses. At a time when people had no defence against virulent diseases, rules are laid down which exclude those with skin diseases from wider society, for the protection of the whole people.

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 10:31 – 11:1

Paul is talking to early Christians about how to behave when dining with pagans. Paul balances the freedom of the Spirit, which no longer requires strict adherence to the Law of Moses, and the need to avoid shocking the conscience of others.

Gospel Mark 1:40-45

Jesus heals a man with a virulent skin disease and puts himself at risk of being rendered ritually unclean in the process. There is nothing any of us could ever do that Jesus would not be willing to heal, at whatever cost to himself.

A bitter-sweet week?

The good news is that it is half-term. So a little relief for you teachers and parents who are driven to distraction by the on-line lessons. Enjoy it. But then Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and so the beginning of Lent. It used to be all doom and gloom. Give up doing the things that you most like doing, like eating sweets or alcohol. Now the emphasis is on the positive. You always come to mass in great number on Ash Wednesday. We shall be streaming the mass at 10 am but it will be recorded so you can choose your time to log on. Lockdown is providing us with enough penance. Think about it. Pick out the good things God is giving us. Much caring and generosity is happening. It is time to enjoy – perhaps be a little patient – with the family. Think of the giving you are doing in this time when many are in need: food for the food banks, contacting lonely people by phone or text. These are this year's opportunities for "doing penance" with the discipline it imposes. And you do it willingly.

Communion preparation

All the families involved have this week received by email a video and Powerpoint to help them with the present chapter of their book: I Belong. Nicola and Teresa have produced an excellent aid. It contains lovely cartoon videos of Daniel in the lion's den and the caring shepherd that will brighten up this week's learning. And then in the video the children have acted out what you have to do. Children learn well from other children. So we are making good progress. Soon you will be ready for the first confessions, though at present I do not know how we can arrange them. God will show us.

Ash Wednesday

Mass will be streamed at 10 am. I think we will need virtual ashes this year. The bishops have suggested we could stand at the door and sprinkle ashes on the top of your head. No touching of course. It really does not seem practical. You have had to put up with having no communion for so long. You can be patient with being deprived of ashes!
