# Feast of the Body and blood of Christ

Or: Corpus Christi. "Get real" Pope Francis keeps insisting. Jesus does. We do believe that Jesus is really present, is really our food when we receive him at mass. It is this belief and practice that defines us as Catholic and differing from many other Christians. Today is a day for thinking: How seriously do I take Jesus when I receive the host? In times past receiving communion was much less frequent. Mass was a time for awe: the greatness of God. Only a priest dared touch the host and chalice. Taking Holy Communion to the sick he would speak to no one, such was his reverence. It is totally good that now so many more receive, and so frequently. Jesus is food for our journey. Not a reward for being good, but nourishment giving energy, joy, enthusiasm to our faith. On a mum's birthday we tell her how much we appreciate all the love she gives in feeding and caring for us. So today we do for Jesus.

Now our practice at mass is casual. Have we gone too far in relaxing all the emphasis on the gap between little me and God? Too careless about how we receive communion? Chattering as we return to our seat? Failing to spend some quiet time before and after receiving him? The precious time for talking familiarly with Jesus is immediately after we return to our bench. We can pay a visit to the church to pray to him, really there. These are all good things for all of us to review today.

Today we conclude this year's series of special masses for the first communicants. Next week I hope to begin a review of how it went. I ask parents and families to tell me whether they felt the programme was good, and all their feelings about the day of their child's first communion. We have a lot to learn before we decide another programme.
