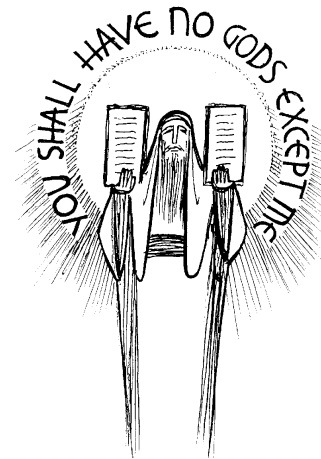

HOMEWORK FOR WEDNESDAY'S DISCUSSION

Living as we do in the midst of such rapid change: What sort of church/parish/family life will be fit for purpose by the year 2025? Ten days ago in our Lent discussion we left off with much in the air: What buildings/administration will we need? What form of mass, prayer, teaching, preaching, caring? What contribution to seasoning secular culture with Christian beliefs? A big question mark hangs over the figure of a bishop, and still more a priest. What should he be?

So please give this question some thought before you come this Wednesday to Becket at 8 pm. It is not to praise or to criticise the priests you have. But simply to work out: What sort of priest will be needed or fit in to the church in 2025? And while you are doing it think also: Every one of us is a priest. Do you believe it? Does it mean anything or is it just pious talk?

"CHRISTIAN INITIATION"

The name sounds like some sort of archaic Druidic process. In fact it means that at the Easter Vigil – only 4 weeks hence – we will welcome with delight 9 new members to our parish family. They have learned, studied, thought, prayed together regularly - some for over a year. Now it is our task and our joy to accompany them more seriously. The business of belonging has started for each of them but is far from complete. First by prayer in these 4 weeks we accompany them. Then we must think of practical ways in which we help them to take up all the practices we enjoy and that enrich our lives and families.
