Second Reading 1 Peter 2:20-25


Peter calls us to turn back "to the shepherd and guardian of our souls". We are called to do what is right, even if it means suffering.

Ministers of Communion

If you know of any, please do let us know without delay. "I don't like to trouble you" is often heard. Bringing you communion is not trouble. It is what we are here for.
