FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT (B)

20th December 2020

Today's readings are examples of seeking wisdom and trying to work out the best thing to do. David wants to know if he should build a magnificent piece of architecture as God's dwelling place, whilst Mary wonders how she can be the one who provides the precious dwelling for the unborn Son of God.

First Reading 2 Samuel 7:1-5. 8-12. 14. 16

David is getting ready for his next big project. Having overcome his enemies, he wonders if he now needs to build a house for the ark of God. God. however, has different ideas of greatness.

Second Reading Romans 16:25-27

In his letter to the Romans, Paul explains that the mystery which has puzzled generations of seekers of truth has now been resolved. The wisdom of God has been revealed in the person of Jesus.

Gospel Luke 1:26-38

We see two sides of Mary's character. She is a meek and humble servant of the Lord but she is also a strong and courageous young woman, able to ask sensible questions, even of an angel, the messenger of God.

Responsorial Psalm I will sing forever of your love, O Lord



As Christmas draws near so the coronavirus seems to be increasingly ominous. I wonder what the good Lord is telling us by this? One theme has been coming through the Advent liturgies as we have read and are reading the Old Testament prophets.

In the time of Isaiah and others, God's people were not paying him attention. The kings were almost completely a bad lot. They expected God to win their battles for them, but then forgot him and turned to their self-serving evil practices. So God stopped winning their wars. Kings and people were taken into forced labour in Babylon. From their misery and slavery they remembered and sighed for God and his home in Jerusalem, sometimes called Sion.

Are we experiencing something similar? We fear that the Christmas-time relaxation of disciplines won by hard graft, is going to lead to another surge in infections. We have a part to play in preventing that. But just as Christmas is about to break upon us the hope of the vaccines dawns. Still much is uncertain. The only certainty is the presence of Jesus, our awareness of it concentrated and reinforced by our Nativity celebrations. *All was still* the carol tells us. If we are still now we will find him. The best gift of all.



New heating

Much planning and consultation has been going on quietly for many months. The agreement – for a total replacement of all heating and water services in church, friary and Beckett has been struck with Hellabys of Ongar. They intend beginning the work in the second week of January and will take most of 6 months to complete.
