Jesus did not exploit his equality with God.



# PARTICIPATION IN THE EASTER TRIDUUM

It starts on Holy Thursday evening with a sense of the church gathered in fraternity with the Lord who is making provision for us for all time; he is establishing the sacrifice of the New Testament; his enduring legacy. The evening starts with a warm being together with Christ. He longed to share this Passover meal with us and in washing of the feet, He tells us we are to serve the world. However, the transitory nature of our life here is expressed because the evening ends with foreboding and the invitation to watch and pray. We invited to stay and watch a while with Christ, that evil will not overcome us. Christ's presence enables us to overcome all the evil the world can serve up. In some sense I think that this is the worse agony for Christ. The devil is coming back for "his appointed time" after the Temptation in the wilderness. Christ triumphs in the agony in the Garden, He is determined to do the Father's Will and while on the next day there is an orgy of hatred and cruelty, He is calm through it. His bravery to calls us to be strong in the time of temptation.

On Good Friday, the Cross is venerated and becomes the focus to which we genuflect and show our affection. We should not be ashamed of the Cross as mankind's attempt to get rid of God but be uplifted by it, because it reveals the depth of God's love for us. On the other hand, it should convince us of the great tragedy that sin is and help us to find it repugnant and do all we can to avoid it. This liturgy often leaves me with an empty feeling of absence. That is part of our life with God in this world. It is also a feeling that things are not complete and we wait for the completion on the Saturday night.

The Vigil starts with the Paschal Candles as the focus: new fire, new light, the praise of Christ the Light come into the world. Then the story of salvation. May be, if you have the imagination, we could think of ourselves as a pilgrim people gathered around the fire hearing the stories of our people. The scriptures started as an oral tradition and the way in which the people came to belong was hearing the stories of our people. It all builds up to the story of the triumph of Jesus in the defeat of death; the story of liberation and salvation. This atmosphere can be re-created by reading in candle-light and then the burst of light as the Gloria begins the joy of Easter. Then we get into the renewal of life in the Baptism liturgy. The humble and useful element water that has been absent from church for a few days is blessed with a blessing that recounts the story of how God has used water to liberate us.

Then we joyfully renew our vows committing ourselves again to live the life of Christ in our own lives.



In a word, in the Easter Triduum, we travel with Christ in our prayer with the Church in order to Passover with Him to the risen life, which starts in this world, and will be fulfilled in the world to come.
