When we friars handed our Nottingham parish back to the Diocese we retained the premises and site of its Greyfriars Club. The Diocese had no interest in it. We knew its value; not least, it was giving employment to a goodly number, now sadly sacked. I heard this week that despite current problems the steward with a single assistant, both furloughed, is feeding a hot meal to 80 people every day. Nottingham Council is funding it, having asked if he could manage 100 per week. In addition local support has raised £10,000 for those who have lost their jobs and the many needy of the locality. They are even supplying 2 foodbanks. The spirit of Francis is definitely alive there.

Closer to home. Gloria Gottschalk writes of her experience volunteering to work with the local Hope Family Trust in Barking. "I started" she wrote "in their large warehouse in Dagenham sorting hundreds upon hundreds of cans of baked beans into date order. Over the following weeks more & more volunteers appeared mainly young girls in their late 20s and early 30s who had been furloughed: teachers, a dentist, a physiotherapist. One a student from Woodford County High. Another from Trinity. We became one happy family. Donations to the food bank declined as more people moved on to online delivery. The need increased from 12 referrals per day before Covid to 60 per day. The food bank also accepts clothing and provides 100 hot meals per day in Barking."

Recently Pope Francis quoted the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius: "The person will make progress in the spiritual life to the degree that they go out of self-love, self-will and self-interest". He is looking towards the much-changed church that will emerge eventually from Covid. Its preoccupation lies in service of the poor and marginalised. Not in its internal business.

Church opening

Things are nearly always more complicated than expected. We asked for open churches – though not all deemed it wise. From Monday we can open for individual visits. But Oh - the complications.

There are stringent conditions to be obeyed. Chief among them is that at least 2 stewards must be in attendance at all times access is permitted. And after each open period the areas accessed by the public must be thoroughly cleaned and sanitised. The Office are well ahead in there preparation of the church, provisions of signage, hand sanitisers and notices.

We cannot start until we have volunteers, themselves not vulnerable, ready and willing to spend an hour or more ensuring all regulations are carefully observed.

I think we cannot complain. We want everyone to be completely safe and no threat to others. I believe the same requirements are made of any shop or venture that will open to public use this week.

Many catholic churches are not opening. I find that any parish I have consulted is only opening its church for shortish designated periods in the week.

All is provisional. We have decided to open for 3 periods of 2 hours duration: On Tuesday 10am —12 noon Thursday 2pm - 4pm Saturday 10am to 12 noon We will review it after this week

And pray for the day when we can return "rejoicing into the house of God" to celebrate mass together.
