The Christmas Story

At this time of year, there always seems endless things that we should give our attention to. In the friary, we have had the thought, who is going to see Brother Raymond today and take him Holy Communion. That concern has sadly come to an end but now it is how do we fittingly celebrate his passing? All of us have different calls on our attention. The ordinary business of family life with perhaps particular concerns about a child and then the relationships and business of work. We are forever switching our attention from one to the other and concentration on one thing is a big problem. Then there are narratives in the background about particular people we know who are ill or in difficulty. The point about the Christmas story is that God is with us at our side sharing all those concerns with have and helping us to answer without anxiety. Do what you believe you have to do in moment and don't even think about the moments to come. The help will come when it is the time for it. Despite our many concerns there is a time for celebration and it is now. Happy and peaceful Christmas to you all.
