ORANGE OR LEMON?

St. Thomas' was represented at an important event on Thursday, 20th March. Boris Johnson was on site, with his trowel, to plant an orange tree on the old St. Clement's Hospital site (Mile End Road). This marked the success of a long campaign begun by TELCO in 2004. We campaigned to make this site a Community Land Trust (first CLT in London). By 2011 we had got support from both Mayors' and Prime Ministerial Candidates'. The East London CLT is buying 23 of the 230 units which will be sold. To local residents who have registered with the CLT. These properties will cost 50% of market value.

Now to get a similar deal on The Olympic Site, Boris has promised to fight with every muscle to ensure this; he will plant a lemon tree there!

You may remember that in the autumn last year, the parish TELCO group conducted a "listening Campaign" after some of the Sunday Masses to obtain parishioners stories in relation to care home and care provided in the community.

The campaign still goes on, but now it has reached a national level and on Mon. 31st March 20.30am—11.45am there will be a "tea party" action meeting in Parliament Square (or the Methodist Central Hall if raining) which will be attended by the Minister for Care; Norman Lamb. Could the purification we experience after death be understood in this way, namely, as an opening of our vision and heart to a light and a love that are so full so as to force upon us a kind of painful relearning? Might purgatory be understood precisely as us being embraced by God in such a way that warmth and light so dwarf our earthly concepts of love and knowledge that, like a person born blind who is given sight, we have to struggle painfully in the very ecstasy of that light to unlearn and relearn virtually our entire way of thinking and loving? Might purgatory be understood not as God's absence or some kind of punishment or retribution for sin, but as what happens to us when we are fully embraced, in ecstasy, by God, perfect love and perfect truth?

But the breaking in of love and light is, all at the same time, delightful and bewildering, ecstatic and unsettling, wonderful and excruciating, euphoric and painful. Indeed, it's nothing less than purgatory!
