

I am grateful to all who will make today a special day of prayer and those who have organised our part in the sadly rare – public recognition of God and his mysterious will amid all the desolation.

World Day for the poor

Our church has always exercised care for the poor. From soon after Vatican II the "preferential option for the poor" became a mantra of our church's concentration on those suffering the many forms of pain and destitution arising from lack of money, justice and other causes. St Thomas of Canterbury has always been generous in sharing its wealth as you continue to do. But Pope Francis has now added the stress – it is not new – that we must not only care for the poor, but also BE poor. We are a poor church in many ways. Think of the humiliation brought on her by abuse of her clergy and members. Preoccupation with possessions can blind to essential truths and values. St Francis knew he had to get rid of all his possessions in order truly to know Jesus. We are perhaps not called to go quite that far. The poor Jesus must never be far from our thoughts.
