Watching before the Blessed Sacrament

We have just completed our annual time of prayer from the evening of Friday to Midday on Saturday. We prayed in the presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. I hope it was a good experience in terms of strengthening your love for Christ and confirming your faith. An important aspect of our prayer life is to give it time and knowing how to use the time. Our church is open from 8 a.m. to 6.30 p.m. each day giving opportunity for time to be spent praying. If you decide to spend some time then try to split it up.

Firstly, relax your body and clear your mind taking your time to do so. Then a little reading of scripture from your phone or missal allows God to speak to you. Read just a little and ponder on it, discovering what it is saying to you. Then you might respond with prayers of intercession. Picture each member of your family and present them to the Lord for His blessing. Then there are so many people to pray for presented to us by the media.

Then you might say a decade of the rosary or pray the Jesus prayer; 'Lord Jesus Christ have mercy on me a sinner.' This prayer is said continuously in time with our breathing. We might want just to be silent with our mind at rest and just stay there.

It is always good to finish with thanksgiving to God because prayer is always a two way street.

There are several ways of prayer and we should explore them to find our way of praying.
