Second Reading Romans 5:12-19


Jesus' gift of divine life more than outweighs the loss suffered by Adam when he fell.

Children's liturgy?

Quite a few have asked when we will resume the Children's liturgy. You are right to ask for this. The readings and homily of the mass that fit adults are no use to younger children. Yet they need to hear Jesus' words and actions in a way they can understand. Many of the books and colouring you bring may be good to keep them quiet. They do nothing for what are your children's needs.

So we are looking for volunteers who will do some simple teaching. Surely it is what you are doing daily at home with your own children. You know the levels and means of communication that work. If you do not feel up to doing the teaching we still need you. We need others to give supporting care. Safeguarding regulations are strict. We follow them to the letter. There is a ratio of children to adults. That means that if we have 20 children we need 4adults duly cleared for safety. Now it is unfair to expect anyone to do it every Sunday. The plan is to establish a rota so that each provides the service only once a month. So initially we are looking for at least 20 who will offer their services once a month, faithfully.

I have to put it to you squarely. Do you come to mass expecting everything to be provided for you? Or do you come as part of the family, ready and willing to take your share of the tasks and services? I have no doubt that if you are in the latter category you will feel much happier and all will benefit.
