First Reading Acts of the Apostles 2:42-47 The whole community remained faithful to the teaching of the apostles.


Second Reading 1 Peter 1:3-9

Holy Week

I am grateful for the many messages of approval I have heard for the special liturgies from Palm Sunday to Easter day. For long years it seems these services have had to be restricted because of covid. This year thanks to you we have celebrated them to the full. I want to thank you who with us friars have made them special. The list is long: the rotacarers with ministers of communion, readers, ushers, sacristans, launderers and cleaners planned in advance, and took their turns. The musicians spent many hours of rehearsal, as did also our lovely group of young servers. Few churches can match the dignity and devotion with which these very young and regular people took their part. Liturgy makes so much more sense when you are actively engaged with a task. I notice this each day when in the Eucharistic prayer at mass I say: "...giving thanks that you have held us worthy to be in your presence and minister to you." It is not just the priest who brings Jesus to the altar. It is all of you, each taking your part, that brings Jesus to us. Thank you for doing it so enthusiastically and well this week.

"A full church"

Twice on Easter day the number coming to Mass had us wondering whether the church was "safe". Health and Safety has set a limit to the number we may allow. It would be a good problem to have more often. - We are working to restore the children's liturgy. I hope very soon all those who have volunteered will come together for a little training, compliance with safeguarding regulations, and planning to make a start. Also I anticipate some booklets and papers that will not just keep the children amused, but provide basic instruction about Jesus, are now available in the Parish Shop.
