# **Synodality**

The Tablet reported last week: "Slowly but steadily Pope Francis' synodal reform of our church is moving forward". In some ways we have been doing it for a long time. It is like a good family. Each sees what needs to be done for the common good of the family, and picks up the tasks thoroughly and generously. There is a constant need of ensuring continuity. As members can no longer go on others need to move to take up the tasks. Covid put the brakes on the provision for continuity and we are working to get it into motion again.
