We may think of Advent as a time of light-hearted celebration as we get ready for Christmas, but today's liturgy looks at it in a very different way, with warnings of disasters and exhortations to stand firm and pray constantly for the strength to survive all that is going to happen.

First Reading

1 Thessalonians 3:12 – 4:2

St Paul urges his readers to make more and more progress in the kind of life that they are meant to live.
