Jesus uses the parable of the vineyard to warn the Jewish leaders of their failures in leadership.





Back to church

Gradually the numbers really present at mass are increasing. It is good to see the children returning with their parents. Mass is essentially a family event. Streaming is good but no substitute for the real thing. Saturday morning seems most popular. There have been empty pews on Saturday evenings and Sundays, so do not hesitate to book in.

More masses?

We priests are willing and eager to provide. The problem is to find sufficient stewards and cleaners. We are much in debt to the generous stewards. For weeks - even months by now – they have given a great deal of time each week to care for us and you. I thank you very warmly: stewards acting with such grace and readiness. I think though of the Last Straw that - in the proverb – broke the camel's back. We need to share the task more broadly. Can you help? Communion preparation

More than 100 young people will hope to receive H Communion for the first time next May. How on earth can we prepare them? It is obviously impossible to bring 50 children each Saturday morning to Becket - as we have previously done. Instead we have prepared a feasible plan of how to teach them. The preparation starts this week. Over the next 2 Wednesdays we have invited the parents of these children to come to the church to hear how their child will be taught in the period up till Christmas. We hope in these 2 meetings to start a home-based programme that will be a very rewarding exercise. Trust us!

To avoid any confusion: You need to come only once. It is the same exercise on 7^{th} and 14^{th} October repeated because of numbers.

Adoration this Friday-Saturday

Why? Jesus many times says: Ask Pray Seek. We very much want to be free of the virus. We cannot expect that is to happen if we do not heed his instructions – to ask. But then why at night? A long tradition comes down from the Desert Fathers & Mothers in the 3rd century AD and then steadily reinforced through the monasteries, teaching us that the middle of the night is a good time to pray. All is still. Especially if you have managed a time of rest to clear the mind and feelings. We talk to God. More important we listen. We tell him how we feel, what we want. A bible and particularly a Gospel can be a help. Read a passage slowly, build up the picture with imagination, go back over it. Be still. Look

at him. Listen
