

Arrangements to deal with the covid 19 threat have been changing daily this past week. They may yet go further. When we heard two weeks ago that all masses had been cancelled in Korea we did not dream that the prohibition would reach us. So we can for the moment not come together to celebrate in mass and worship the faith we share. We friars believe that we should be with you particularly in times of trouble, yet here we are distanced by indisputable restrictions. More than that we are humbled by the number of offers we receive from you to come to help us as we self-isolate perforce due to our vulnerability of medical conditions and

The essentials of pastoral service we continue to provide nonetheless. We continue, perhaps more intensely, our daily pattern of prayer for you and all. As do the other two religious houses of our parish in Chigwell and the Holy Family. If any good can be seen in this affliction it is the possibility that it may bring many, till now obsessed with secular values, to find their need of God.

When St John in his nineties was asked What are we? his answer was: We are children of God. At the root of our being we have no power over birth and death. Medical knowledge and skills can palliate, but ultimately we cannot control our health or fortune. We are helpless babes in God's loving arms. If we can go back to a serious realisation of that we will gain from the disaster.

Today is Mothers' Day. We thank God for our own mothers and all who take on this noble task of giving themselves selflessly to their babes and children. They mirror closely how God is treating each one of us: feeding, soothing, cleaning putting up with all manner of poor response. grateful for the smallest signs of returning love
