First Reading Isaiah 63:16-17; 64:1. 3-8


The Prophet cries out for God to tear the heavens open and come down to save us.

# **Happy New Year!**

Last Saturday we celebrated our Christmas Fayre and it was a joyful celebration. As soon as we entered the Trinity School Hall, you could feel there was a 'buzz' about the place. The children were excited and were meeting up with friends and the adults relaxed in the very friendly atmosphere. The parish showed itself in a very good light. This Sunday we celebrate the beginning of a New Year in the life of the Church. The Celebrant at Mass will be wearing purple vestments but it is not Lent; Advent has a distinct character. It is a season of expectation in which we hold back on enjoyment we can engineer immediately, in order to await the iov God can gift us with. This 'holding back' does not fit with the parties and gatherings that happen at this time.

Advent is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighed down and distracted by the cares of this world. One way to prepare our hearts and minds is to make use of the Sacrament of Penance. In a new year we are encouraged to examine the direction of our life and seek closer union with Our Lord. The Parish Penitential Service will be on Monday 11th December at 7.30 p.m. with opportunity for individual confession. On the day before, Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> at 4.30 p.m., will have the Ecumenical Advent Service. Please take advantage of this time of expectation before celebrating at Christmas our joy in Our Lord.
