### Out of lockdown

Our Health and Safety committee meets very frequently and we will adjust arrangements as appropriate without delay.

# **Parish Council meeting**

For the first time in many months the council met in person distanced around a set of tables. It was an excellent meeting: relaxed but we did a lot. One participant commented: "It was really collegiate" — and I agree. Among other things we set in place arrangements for the Open-air Mass and picnic on 27th June. Discussed possible future patterns of Sunday mass; for the parish AGM; the priority of needed repairs, replacements and refurbishments.

#### Care for the environment

The PC Council also looked at a project of the Diocese which will shortly require our attention. G7, COP26, and David Attenborough are all secular influences shouting of the impending threat to our world. Pope Francis and recent popes have added the Christian dimension that we should be heeding. So we must engage. I can see this as a good opportunity to "do something for the youth". They certainly want a healthy planet. Let's trust our young people to lead this project in parish and diocese.

A very important week for St Thomas' parish. 57 of our young people will cement their commitment both to a personal life with the Lord and of service to his family as they receive the sacrament of confirmation. It has been a difficult year for the preparation. I congratulate you candidates and your families that you have engaged seriously in all the zoom meetings and other activities that have been possible. Particularly. I thank the team and Fr Michael O'Kane who have shown much resourcefulness and given a great deal of time to planning and executing the personal preparation.

# **Evaluation of the Confirmation Programme**

The team has done its task very well. Now they have produced a remarkable evaluation of the entire programme. In three documents they have drawn up a comprehensive summary of the feelings and reactions: first of the candidates, then of their parents, and finally of their sponsors. The result is a mine of information for us to explore, sift, and bring into all our planning for the whole parish. Many say they want "to do something" for youth. This is sincere, often expressed with exasperation because it is felt to be so important. "What do our young people want?" is a frequent cry. Now we have something to get our teeth into. This process of evaluation of what we do and have done should be copied by all our activities.
