## 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Cycle A) Sunday 5th July 2020

We are here because the Lord himself has called us. "Come to me," he says, and we have come to him, full of thanksgiving, to celebrate the Eucharist, to worship him and receive his help.

# First Reading

Zechariah 9:9-10 The Messiah's coming makes our hearts and souls rejoice, for he humbles himself to share our life.

# Second Reading

Romans 8:9. 11-13 We are spiritual people who belong to Christ and are filled with his Spirit.

## Gospel

Matthew 11:25-30 The Lord calls us to come to him, that we may find rest for our souls.



After 16 weeks of closed doors St Thomas is cautiously opening so that we can celebrate mass together. This very good news, but it must start – and continue – with caution. The covid 19 virus is still rampant. Our over-riding duty is to keep you and ourselves safe from it. It means that the sharing of mass will be strange, with restrictions that may seem annoying.

First: anyone who has any even incipient signs of possible infection must stay away. Similarly it is recommended that all who are shielding or vulnerable should not come.

Social distancing is imperative. So the capacity of our church will be between 50 and 70. When that number is reached any further comers will have regrettably to be turned away. We have very severe instructions from government and bishops. There is to be no singing, no touching. On arrival you may have to declare your name and address (test and trace). Stewards will direct you to sanitise your hands and then conduct you to a bench. Families may occupy the same bench. Stewards will direct you if you wish to receive communion, and conduct vou out when mass is finished. No hymn books of course, and no newsletters, leaflets or any paper. What you bring with you please take away.

We have been told to keep it short. Short homilies, no prayer of the faithful.

Stewards will sanitise all surfaces that have been touched immediately after every service and every time the church is open for visits. Giving communion is a moment when a virus could conceivably be passed on. You are invited to receive communion. If you find it dangerous or are unable to follow these instructions then please simply make a spiritual communion as you have had to do for weeks.

Stewards will conduct you in order. They will start from the front of one side -aisle, and lead you as you are accustomed to the back and then up the middle aisle. There a minister of communion will place the consecrated host on a plate. You will pick this up and place it in your mouth, avoiding contact with the plate as much as possible. Because of distancing, the stewards will lead all from only one side of the church first, and then from the other.

Finally a very practical point. There are NO toilets! Go before you come. We are starting small, in hope of gradually increasing opportunities.

Impossible to provide for all wishing to come on Sunday. So no public mass on Sunday. Streaming at 10am to continue.

Then starting tomorrow 6<sup>th</sup> July: Mass with you on Monday and Friday at 7pm; Wednesday and Saturday at 10am. The church will open 15 minutes before the start time.

We are still waiting on further guidance about baptisms, funerals weddings and other celebratory events. Once these are received we will provide an update to parishioners.
