4th SUNDAY OF LENT Cycle B

11th March 2018



God so loved the world, and was so generous with mercy, that God ordered the rebuilding of the Temple and the return of God's people from exile. Thus we can summarise the themes of today's liturgy. Because of

God's infinite love, we should never doubt that God will forgive us.

First Reading

2 Chronicles 36:14-16. 19-23

Despite the rejection of God by the leaders of the people, God engineers their return after exile through the unexpected agency of the Persian king, Cyrus.

Second Reading

Ephesians 2:4-10

God's love is so great that even when we were dead through our sins, God brought us to life in Christ.

Gospel

John 3:14-21

A simple statement says so much:

"God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

O let my tongue cleave to my mouth
if I remember you not!

PARISH OFFICE

EASTER VIGIL

Will begin at 8 pm on Holy Saturday. Two readings set and develop the theme: the story of Creation and that of the Exodus. Life and new life. God made everything; God led the Israelites out of slavery, through the Red Sea. We hear these in the dark, since Jesus is in the tomb. But suddenly a light appears: Jesus is risen! He is now giving new life, real life. We relish the news, and then move on to do what he told us: celebrate the Eucharist. In the middle of this we baptise and confirm 6 newcomers, and receive 4 already Christian into full communion of our church. Do come and welcome them. Enjoy a truly dramatic ceremony, certainly the best of the year – and then some cheese and wine in Becket. I estimate the ceremony may take 1 hour 25 minutes, but it is interesting. No sermon – the action speaks for itself.

LENT DISCUSSION

Last Wednesday we tried to look at the shape of our church in the future. Particularly what sort of priests we will have and what their specific role will be. Essentially a priest's job is to be holy and to assist others to be whole and holy. To lead but not control. And that is the job of every lay person as well. We are all priests. We found it hard to identify exactly what the ordained priest's role is. And we found it even harder to grasp that lay people really have a priestly role. So we have more to tease out as we seek to build a church fit for the 2020 decade.

LENT

During Lent each Friday there will be Stations of the Cross after the 10am mass and at 8pm. Also exposition each Saturday for an hour after the morning mass.
