## New arrangements for booking to attend a Mass

As you know due to social distancing requirements, we have a maximum capacity for those attending each Mass, particularly the weekend masses. We now have an **online booking process**. This will be available each week until 11am on each Friday. Bookings are essential for the 6pm Mass on Saturday and the 9am & 11am Masses on Sunday. It is a similar process to booking theatre/cinema tickets, except no payment will be required!

When you arrive at Church on those days, the Stewards will direct you to a bench to accommodate the number of people in your booking.

If your personal circumstances change and you cannot attend the Mass, including the development of any cold like symptoms please cancel the place online as this will allow the seat to be allocated to another parishioner

## Ask and you will receive...

The Gospels are insistent on this duty. If we want to be rid of the virus we must ask, and ask persistently. A number came to church through the night of last Friday to Saturday to do just that. It was a small proportion of the whole parish. We who know the power of prayer have a clear duty to pray the pandemic away. I do however know the surge of prayer constantly going up from hundreds of parish homes, especially from those who are housebound and suffering. Keep it up.

### Adoration

Still the church was well used through the 18 hours. First thanks must go to the stewards/cleaners who were there as always when the church is open, keeping us all safe. I thank the organisers: Paul, Bernadette and especially the office staff; Clare for the flowers and Cathy for the beautiful prayer board. There you saw the prayer cards gathered from children and others to make it a genuine communal act of prayer. The hours of preparation made the setting for the great act of love of our Lord.

### Streaming

Now that the camera is constantly active your opportunity for a virtual visit to the church and participation at mass is greatly increased. It means that all the masses celebrated in the church are transmitted live though not recorded. Mass is at 7 pm on Monday, 10 am on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday, as well as the weekend masses at 6pm Saturday and 9 and 11 on Sunday. God has been very good in giving us streaming just when it is acutely needed. Do not however get too comfortable with it. It is only a substitute for the real thing where we come together as a family and receive Holy Communion. There has been room for more at most recent weekend masses.

## Holy Communion preparation

Well over 100 parents went home happily from the 2nd training session of past Wednesdays. I can understand you feeling daunted by the task of home teaching of your children. But the work book is a delight, for the children and for you parents. You will all enjoy doing it together. So we are now working through chapter one. It is to explore the importance of Belonging. Belonging to a nuclear family: belonging to God's family both in our home and in his house. You need to complete this section in October, ready to move on to the next topic in November. Nicola and Teresa offered a lot of help, and we are ready to hear anything you need.
