Moving on from that I gradually discovered my many unrecognised assumptions and prejudices that needed to be dealt with. Have I finished this journey of self-awareness? I wonder. The demos in support of BLM, neglecting anti-infection, are to be regretted. They can though drive us to question ourselves.

An impressive number have come to pray quietly before the Blessed Sacrament while the church has been briefly open. We will open at the same times this coming week. Tuesday & Saturday 10am-12pm, Thursday 2-4pm.



What's next for the Church

On Tuesday we heard the announcement that, from the 4th July, places of worship will be able to reopen for prayer and services. We welcome this news with great joy. The recent reopening of our churches for individual private prayer was an important milestone on our journey towards resuming communal worship. We have put in place all the measures needed to ensure the risks of virus transmission are minimised. This includes effective hand sanitisation, social distancing, and cleaning.

We will looking over the next days as to how we can safely and successfully move to our opening to include services.
