# First Reading Acts 9:26-31


Barnabas introduces Saul to the apostles, preparing the way for the mission of the future apostle, Paul.

## **Church capacity**

Some said they were puzzled when I suggested a capacity of 500 in last week's letter. I thought it plain: 5 separate opportunities to take part in one of 5 masses between Saturday 10 am and Sunday noon. Each can welcome just over 100, respecting distancing and all requirements. Over last weekend, counting women, men, children and babes in arm there were in total 360.

Surely you have picked up my real concern. We have hundreds of families in the parish. Just the annual tally preparing for First Communion is over 100. They have parents and siblings so do the maths. All these children are going to be very much in need of Jesus through their entire future. It is very easy to lose good habits – as you are experiencing. I cannot see how your children are being adequately prepared and nourished for a mature future if they do not come to mass regularly. Jesus was not kidding when he said: "Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood you cannot have life in you." Our newspapers are full of "successful" men who have no life in them.
