Towards normality

Weekly church services have moved towards what prevailed prior to the pandemic. The big difference is that we are still being cautious. The church is kept well ventilated and all surfaces are sanitised with an anti-viral treatment. While the Becket programmes were suspended we used the opportunity to reorder and redecorate all the upstairs rooms. They are now resplendent, and the usual uses are returning one by one. The Becket committee deserves our thanks. Not only did they plan and supervise the work. Several of the committee spent many hours restoring woodwork to its pristine state. I thank you all for your kind service. And a big thank you to George for his painstaking work to such a high standard.

Sacrament of reconciliation

Or confession if you like. During the lockdown the confession room in church was considered unfit for use lacking ventilation. That still is true. We found that the Friary parlour with its plexiglass screen provided a preferable setting. The sacrament is better seen as a conversation between penitent and priest. We will continue to use this arrangement for the present. You will find a priest available after the 10am mass each Saturday. But we are always available to give you the sacrament. Just ask or call for an appointment. I am glad to report that many are doing this regularly now. Do not think you are interrupting or inconveniencing us. It is one of the most important parts of our duty to you.

This Sunday there will be one open air Mass at 11.30am in the friary gardens. Following the mass please bring your picnic. There will be some seats for the elderly and infirm: otherwise please bring something to sit on.

Certificate of Practice
