To be here we have left the places of our ordinary living and come together to worship, celebrate and ponder the ways of the Lord. Yet here we will rediscover our ordinary lives and see them in new ways. Learning from the Lord, we can return to our places in the world, and live them more hopefully, more lovingly.

First Reading (Proverbs 31:10-13. 19-20. 30-31)

When the writer of Proverbs looks for an image to finish his book, and sum up what practical wisdom looks like, he offers a picture of the "perfect wife".

Second Reading (1 Thessalonians 5:1-6)

As Paul writes to some of the earliest Christians, he is concerned that they learn to live their lives in joyful expectation, rather than in anxiety about the future

Gospel (Matthew 25:14-30)

Today's Gospel tells us the familiar parable of the "talents". However small the work set before us, we are each called to respond with care and creativity.
