ANDREW McMAHON OFM

On Monday some of the friars will be traveling down to Portsmouth Diocesan Pastoral Centre at Wickham in Hampshire for the funeral of Father Andrew McMahon of our Order. If you have lived in this parish for many years, you may remember a young Father Andrew who was in charge of training men who were joining the Order as brothers. He trained them in prayer and in the life of a Franciscan and they went to Loughton College to do courses in cooking, bookkeeping and various other trades. After that he went down to Southampton into a community that was inserted in the ordinary life of the city, finding various ways of helping the life of the city. Andrew in collaboration with a secular priest and other collaborators, founded the St Dismus Centre which catered for ex-prisoners and also offered help to alcoholics. Andrew received the OBE for this work. He was a director of the Centre dealing one to one with some guite difficult men. Andrew was a strong man well able to take hard decisions when dealing with awkward people. After serving in this role for 20 years he moved on to be chaplain at the Pastoral Centre, looking after a community of Indian Sisters and helping with the visitors to the Centre. He learnt to say Mass in the Indian style which he had learnt in a visit to India. He was also Chaplain to Southampton Football Club giving guidance to the lads in the academy as they entered the strange world of professional football. Andrew was like a number of friars down through the years who followed St Francis but found community life constricting, He was a devout man always searching for God and helping others in their search. He is an example of the way God uses our individual gifts to serve others. May he rest in peace.
