The people of God

That is how Vatican II described the essence of our Catholic Church. But are we convinced of this?

Currently we see two schools of thought. The first is the vision of Vatican II. The people of God are the large number of lay people. Bishops and priests also belong, in the role of being your servants. The other is one of heavy inflexible rules dominated by authority. It sees the clergy in charge, ordering the life of the faithful, and inevitably in control.

Bishop Alan

Of these two, Bishop Alan reminds us today, only the first is feasible. It was the basis of the reordering of the Diocese when it commenced several years ago. The need for it is certainly being reinforced by what is sometimes called "the shortage of priests". Priests are ageing and retiring and dying and not being replaced. Even if we wanted the old authoritarian style there are not priests to do it. Yet the signs are that few can see this. We are sleep-walking into decline and decay.

For us the vision Bishop Alan presents is that our 3 parishes – StoC, St Anne Line and Wanstead are to be a partnership served by only 2 priests.

The Diocesan Plan

Just think how this could work. Only if lay people seriously take over preparation for the sacraments, care for the sick, lonely, bereaved, and poor. Thank God much of it is in your hands here at SToC. We are definitely a Vatican II church. But the catechists carers organisers and the rest are all ageing. The next generation has not yet emerged to pick up the tasks.

Responsibility

In addition there is a need to accept the responsibility for organisation. We are in fact 3, each close-knit communities. It seem unrealistic that we can become one. So Pastoral Councils are essential. They are the replacement for the previous organising priests. The number of priests wearing out goes on relentlessly. The process of replacement, not only of priests but now also of those maintaining each of the operations of parish, has stalled for several years. Faith and hope obviously are the way ahead. But they only work if we take them and use them. We need to talk
