

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

Through this week we friars, have reflected on how astonishingly good you are to us. Thank you for the Christmas church collection. Not content with that generosity we have been deluged with your greetings and gifts. For all of them we thank you very much and note well how fortunate we are to be with you making St. Thomas' parish.

The year now come to its end has been a good one for our parish. In the summer you chose a newly constituted Pastoral Council. Already you have seen some of the good they are doing. More plans are in the pipeline and will slowly become apparent. Some refurbishment of our buildings and surrounds have started and more are in prospect. Among then we do hope to raise the temperature of the church.

The eagerness of applicants for both of our schools bears testimony to their excellence. Allied to this service of the young you lead various ventures to provide them with faith understanding, social and fun activities to bring them into the functioning community. You go out to meet a wide variety of needs, hugely through the great work of the SVP addressing the growing need for visits and support to the increasing number of housebound and dependent on carers; the Soup Run, Bereavement Group, those making us aware of dementia and what can be done. TELCO keeps us involved in the wider social needs and the value of gently persuasive lobbying. We are a parish enjoying much of the good things of the technical world, but also of not a few experiencing its more brutal face.

The life of prayer is well and healthy. The 24 hours adoration surprised many. With three Mass Centres the organisation of church services is demanding.

You have it well organised through many groups. We have heeded Pope Francis leading us into the realisation that we are a totally new church. We are different from the church in which most of us grew up: different in how we approach God, how we see him, talk to him, where we find him.

A quick summary would suggest that a real grasp of God's merciful love and mercy has taken over from sin as the whole focus of our spirit and life. Pope Francis is leading the church at a gallop, and we, though trailing, have made good progress in coming to his vision and practice.

No room to rehearse the whole range of good things in St. Thomas'. We will get round to them. As for the year now beginning, I suggest two areas on which we should concentrate: our personal and collective prayer. And our learning to see with the eyes of Pope Francis, and to act accordingly.

CHILDREN PRAY FOR PEACE

The General Minister of the Order wrote us a Xmas message. He did no more than relay a letter he had received from a mother of a family in Aleppo. Under bombs and starvation she and her family had moved from trauma to disaster many times only eventually to find refuge in the friars' church together with scores of others. It was a letter of gratitude and hope.

The Minister has asked us to organise a world-wide exercise of prayer. We are to arrange that at the children's Mass on one Sunday each month the children will pray for peace, especially in the Middle East. So, as a start, next Sunday we will do this at the 10am Mass.
