Second Reading 1 Corinthians 1:10-13. 17


Paul appeals for unity among the followers of the Lord.

The life of contemplation

This week's feast of St Anthony of the desert (not, to be noted, not he of Padua) brings to mind the need of serious commitment to this essential element of our church and so of every parish. Anthony stands for a large movement, in the early centuries of our church, of people who sought out solitude in order to dedicate themselves totally to prayer. Greek philosophers and many others visited Anthony to engage him in secular thought and affairs. He staunchly rejected them as dangerous to his single-minded contemplation. I believe we have here in our parish people similarly committed to a life of prayer. Many are housebound. They have little of incident in their lives. But they find acceptance of their restricted horizons and company in trusting prayer to the Lord.

Their carers

Fortunately there are several caring people who identify the needs of the many sick, housebound, and those imprisoned by mental and physical illness. They consistently visit, shop, bring Holy Communion to them, transport them to medical and hospital treatment. Much of their caring goes unnoticed. But today I want to recognise what they do, and thank them. I know there are also other faithful members of the parish who have borne the many tasks and duties of making our parish through their active years. And then when they fall sick we do not give them the similar care they deserve. The need is heavy on my conscience. More on this subject next week, particularly concerning ministers of communion.

Diversity in Church Unity week

Once upon a time we thought the only true religion was to be found in the Catholic Church. It is quite natural to think that our way of doing things is better than others. But gradually a realisation has spread widely that diversity is an important thing in all fields of life and experience. The Pope tells us to dialogue with each other. The churches of the Reformation have taught us the importance of careful listening to the Word of God in the bible. Perhaps Congregationalists give us a needed warning to avoid the clerical love of power and control. This week we try to take Ecumenism seriously. We will register our commitment in the Unity service this evening in St Paul's church Woodford Bridge at 6.30 pm.
