# World Day for the Poor

In a way the Pope's message for this day contains nothing new. It is still insistent. We live in a world where money and resources are badly skewed, causing huge injustice and suffering. Many live in a world of "virtual reality". Pursuing each their own interest they are like men in the old-fashioned corridor of distorting mirrors. They do not see what is real. So first we need the discipline and therapy of getting real about poverty: in church-talk we need to be evangelised by the poor.

Next: we feel impotent to remedy the imbalance. Yet we need to latch on to any governmental or other programme or project aiming to help the destitute, in order to throw what weight we have behind it. Solidarity is his word. It is what we do when we try to comfort the sorrowful. We cannot take the pain away but the one suffering finds support and that helps. So Pope Francis. I notice the amount of giving that goes on in St. Thomas of Canterbury. Keep it going.
