Easter Vigil Mass

God brought his people out of Egyptian slavery: he brings us out of slavery to our habits of sin. The pillar of fire dies down. The Easter candle appears: Jesus is risen. From the candle everyone takes a lighted taper. The church looks like a huge birthday cake. *Christ our light* we all sing. Then we move on to baptism, receiving new members into our church and for them - *First*, for all of us: Communion. And a party in Becket afterwards. Come and enjoy it.

And the lead up to it

It starts with the Palm Procession. At 11.30am next Sunday go to the Becket Centre, not to the church. We sing a robust round led by the drum moving into church. Jesus is the flavour of the week. But the mood changes. We who were shouting Hosanna! now shout Crucify him! as we hear Luke's account of the passion. That is our fickle love. Through the days of Holy Week the tension mounts until the Mass of the last supper on Maundy Thursday at 8 pm.

The Liturgy is for everyone.

Liturgy is not for spectators: It demands participation. Holy Week offers a range of opportunities to be involved in the actual life of Christ. We recall what happened in the past, in Jesus' last week on earth, and also spell out in the rich symbols of the church services how it is happening in our concrete experience now.

You can enter seriously into Holy Week by taking on one of the many roles that are needed for the several liturgies. Please look at the lists at the back of the church for the help required. At Christmas Michael found it very hard to get willing volunteers for the roles of reader, minister of Communion, usher and others. There was never greater need for strong faith. It is fed by sharing actively. Please commit yourself now.
