

St Thomas of Canterbury AGM

I thank the parishioners who engaged in last Sunday's AGM. It was a good occasion well-used to review the past year and look forward to the next stage as we return from holidays. It had an air of fin de siècle about it as we took a longer view of the Council's work. Two factors have dominated. Covid has had effects both bad but also some good. The other huge benefit has been Pope Francis. During his reign the Parish Council has taken on its due role of managing the parish. The wider church is much divided about sharing all responsibilities, duties and decisions. We have come a long way and sincere thanks were given to Kit for his leadership and practice. A good example of St Paul's "constant concern" for us and church. His membership of the Council has one year to run but under a chair to be chosen.

Our financial position is sound. Premises have been upgraded and greatly improved. More projects are already in hand, notably in the Henrietta suite of Becket, the car park and others. Needs of our rising generations and their faith were not forgotten. Most urgent of all is the replacement of the sound-enhancing system of the church. The process has been tortuous despite expert help and diligent investigation. We are at the point of committing to a contractor and optimistically hope we may have an installation by Christmas.

Now it is over to you. Everywhere we hear the cry: "No one is volunteering". You are busy and beset with problems. Yet if you want something done - ask a busy person. And you are all disciples.
