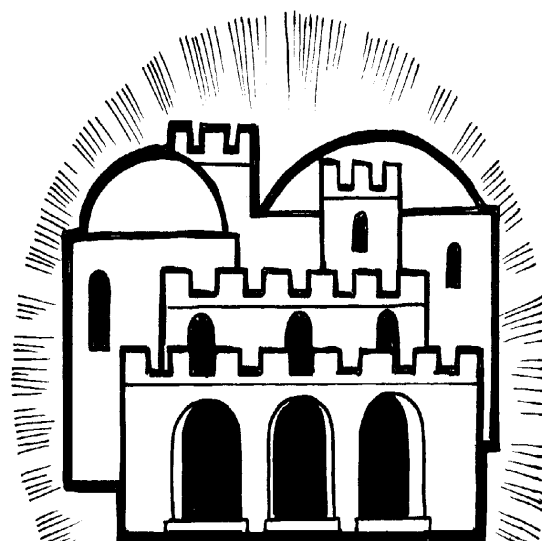

LENT DISCUSSIONS

Do you remember the significant contributions we made to the 2 Roman Synods in 2014 & 2015? The Pope had said: "I want to hear what you are thinking and feeling. Be honest. Don't hold back for fear of being inappropriate, saying something which is not "what the church teaches". This Lent we intend to carry the process further. On 3 or 4 evenings we will start with a nudge, reminding you what the Pope is saying in his letter *Joy Of Love*. We want you to bring out in the open what family life is, what personal struggles are in this stressed world of Trump and Brexit and its uncertainties. The Pope has a totally new approach to our moral and spiritual life. Like a PC app however it needs to be down-loaded, installed in our minds and hearts before it can turn blossom into life.
